



## Walney Island: coastal walk

Distance (km)	Instruction	Notes
0	From the carpark at Earnse Point, turn right to walk north along the west coast of Walney, keeping to the shingle and sands.	
2.9	Enter nature reserve	
5.0	Round the island's north tip, continue south along the island's east coast through the nature reserve and marshes	The England Coastal Path around Walney Island doesn't include the north tip – follow signs for the Coast Path to reduce the length of the walk and avoid the marshlands. In key bird season – keep to the England Coast Path route to avoid disturbing wildlife. Views east to Barrow-in-Furnace
9.2	In the small wood, meet the footpath to Lenny Hill. Continue along the coast.	
9.6	Reach the houses and use the small lane on their shore-side to continue along the coast. After 400m drop back onto the foreshore and continue to the road.	
10.5	Meet the road, turn left and continue south towards Vickerstown. At Jubilee Bridge continue straight ahead on the Promenade, alongside the A590, signed to South Walney.	Ferry Inn
12.2	Continue straight ahead onto Empress Drive as road sweeps to right, opposite the King Alfred. Turn left onto Mikasa Street, then right onto Avon Street. Turn left onto Orion Terrace and the Westminster Road	There are unofficial paths along the coastline if preferred
13.3	At A590 turn left, then left again at Carr Lane towards Biggar. Continue along the roadside, through Biggar. A few hundred metres after leaving the village on Mawflat Lane turn left through the fields to walk a short coastal loop. Return to the Mawflat Lane further south.	Left to marshes, ports, BAE Systems Queen's Arms
20.7	Arrive South End Caravan Park, continue along the lane to its left, continue to the car park, hide and take the path around North east Point. Return along the west coast	South Walney Nature Reserve

24.1	Arrive Walney Lighthouse then follow paths and tracks north along the island's west coast	
35.7	Return to Earnse Point
